Direct Speech	Reported Speech
"I will travel to London next week."	He said that he would travel to London the following week.
"Send me an email." "Don't call me after 9pm."	She told me to send her an email. She told me not to call her after 9pm.
"Are you from Marrakech?"	She asked me if I was from Marrakech.
"Where are you from?"	He asked me where I was from.

Statements

said + (that) + statement

Yes/No Questions

asked + if + Subject + Verb

Wh-Questions

asked + wh-word + Subject + Verb

Imperatives

told + infinitive (to/not to + verb)
