

"I am listening to music now."

"I bought a car last week."

"I <u>was watching</u> a movie <u>yesterday</u>.

"I haven't seen Julie."

"I <u>had taken</u> English lessons before."

Reported Speech

He said (that) he liked ice cream.

- He said (that) he <u>was listening</u> to music <u>then</u>.
- He said (that) he <u>had bought</u> a car the week before.
- He said (that) he had been watching a movie the day before.
- He said (that) he hadn't seen Julie.

He said (that) he had taken English lessons before.

Reported Speech with the imperative (commands)

Direct Order	
"Go to bed!"	He to
"Don't worry!"	He to
"Be on time!"	He to
"Don't smoke!"	He to

he asked me what I was doing.

he asked me who that person





Reported Speech with Yes/No-Questions

Direct Question

"Do you like chocolate?" He asked me *if I liked chocolate*.

"Have you ever been to Mexico?"

"Are you listening to me?"

Reported Question

- She asked me *if I had ever been* to Mexico.
- She asked me *if I was listening to*
- <u>her</u>.


